Secretary's Report Dave Hockaday



The meeting was called to order by President Larry Lewis at 7:45 p.m.

• President Larry Lewis checked for any new members and guests that might have been present. Despite a full house, no new members or visitors were present.

The minutes for the February meeting were read and approved as written.

• Dustin Hedrick provided a Treasurer's for March. Good financial condition was reported. Dustin discussed various bills that had been paid, and announced that the grass cutting contract had been awarded under budget.

- Safety Officer Jay Benson had no reports of safety violations at the field. A discussion followed about making sure PCM radios had failsafe programmed, and that many were operating on PCM without programming this feature. A reminder was made for people using Spectrum Radios to remember that they should always pull and use a pin, to help keep pilots from becoming complacent about the use of the frequency board and control system.
- Jim Charbonneau was unable to attend the meeting. It was noted that there were 117 paid members as of the meeting night.

Old Business

- A discussion about the condition of the flying field took place. Filling cracks, patching, and sealing of the runway will take place after the April Fly-in, and will be at no cost to the club. Grading and reseeding of the grass field will take place after the last event of the fall, to allow time to build the necessary funds to do this job correctly.
- Larry discussed that help is needed to manage the Spring Fly-in on April 21st. Hobby Masters of Raleigh sold RDRC a new Spectrum DX7 radio system at cost for our main prize.
- The Franklin County Airport static display on March 31st was discussed. Setup for the event is to be at 8:30 a.m., and a tear-down time was unknown.
- Larry discussed the mowing contract in detail, and mentioned that the winning bidder was also on standby for possible "afterseason' cutting, to be determined by the weather.
- Josh Bunn mentioned that the first meeting for the instructors in the New Pilot Program will be held at the RDRC field on Sunday, April 1st, at noon.

New Business

President Larry discussed the RDRC Club Charter paperwork. This is a huge undertaking, as he has already used all of the forms that were sent to him, and he is only at the "B"s in the roster! This must be done each year, and the AMA requires much info about the membership and club. Additionally, the landowner has again (as he is each year) been additionally insured for his protection.

- New Name Tags for members was discussed. This has been done in the past, but many new (and older) members do not have nametags. It was unsure who the last person was who had these made, perhaps Cleveland Meeks or George Abbott, and Larry will look into this. Larry needs a list of those who need name badges, so please contact Larry and let him know.
- Drake Edwards announced a possible group trip to the Toledo show in Toledo Ohio, April 13-15. The cost will be approximately \$100 for the trip to cover lodging and such. Please contact Drake or Dane Edwards for more info about this.
- Bryan Long asked the group about the AMA's buddy box program to see if anyone had received their units yet. Based on feedback from other members, it looks as if the AMA buddy boxes are taking approximately 12 weeks to arrive.
- It was noted that the Porta-Potties had been relocated to prevent tipping in high winds.
- The first 50/50 drawing was held at this meeting, and the club's portion of the funds covered the cost of our meeting location! The winning RDRC'r was Terry Campbell.
- The formal meeting was closed at approximately 8:30 p.m.
- A Show-n-Tell program was provided by Bob & Matt Richards on one of Matt's new contest planes. Jim Steffens demonstrated a safety starter holder he was previously spotlighted in the AMA magazine with. A cool sailplane stand was also shown and demonstrated.

Proposed Field Rules Change Posting

A new possible alternative flying location at the field has been discussed at previous RDRC meetings, and a test for this possible location was set up at the southwest end of the field. This proposal is to edit section #3 of the Field Rules to include the use of the alternative flying area at the southwest end of the runway for hovering and extended flying by Helicopters, Foamies, and Micro-Electric models. This is not a requirement, but rather an alternative area for these types of aircraft to operate. A change would also be made to the 5-man rule to allow additional pilots to operate in this area.
