Minutes of the RDRC Meeting July 28th, 2010

The meeting was called to order at 7:36 p.m. by President Larry Lewis.

- 17 members and guests were in attendance.
- One new member and one guest introduced themselves.
- Michaels and Askew-Taylor were brought up as sources for foam board and Depron.

• The treasurers report was given by Dustin Hedrick. Dustin stated that we have total funds of \$7,174 and discussed recent club expenses of \$531.50 including grass mowing, toilets and power. The club discussed and approved the expense of \$100 for a memorial brick at Victory Junction for Jim Charbonneau.

Old Business

• The fall giant scale fly-in will be named "The Big Jim Memorial Fly-In" in honor of Jim Charbonneau.

• Jims Victory Junction plane will be donated to Victory Junction. Josh Bunn will handle this. Discussed flying a plane at Fly for Tots in memory of Jim, a club member will read "High Flight" by John Magee

• The minutes of the June meeting were read by Jason Jarvis. The minutes were passed as read. A safety discussion was lead by Mark Lofgren. Recent events have prompted members to question a need for additional rules. Some expressed an interest in additional rules, others prefer to enforce existing rules and apply a "common sense" approach. Mark circulated suggestion forms inviting members to document safety situations and propose reasonable and enforceable solutions.

New Business

The mall show was discussed. Jason Jarvis is handling arrangements with North Hills. The show will be held on August 28th.

SAFETY FIRST Revisions to the current field rules are near completion and will be posted in next month's newsletter for members' review and comment. Such an important piece of business requires careful attention and input. Fly-for-Tots is the club's primary concern

at August's meeting, so the revisions are tabled for a month to avoid distraction.

The proposed, revised rules are a "tweaking" of existing rules to reflect the changes in members' flying interests, not a massive, oppressive list of do's and don't. The club still operates under the field rules as posted in the RDRC website. Remember to fly from a flight station; huck, hover, zoom and boom east of the paved runway; don't taxi into or out of the pits; don't fly over the pits; give priority to landing aircraft, especially deadsticks; loudly call out your intentions; and be considerate of others.


