SAFETY FIRST...All is quiet on the safety front as far as I know. Some crashes I've recently seen at some other clubs' activities were due to equipment malfunction and not pilot error Some crashes can be excused because our eyes, brain, and hands don't "cooperate" with one another at crucial times. But crashes due to poor aircraft and electronic maintenance can be avoided through diligent attention to regular equipment inspection. We are in for a long hot summer and precautions need to be taken at the field to avoid any heatrelated mishaps. Stay hydrated...drink even if you aren't thirsty. Wear light-colored clothes and use sunscreen. Consider flights shorter in duration than you would ordinarily fly in cooler weather. And if you are flying and feel more "goofy" than usual, please land, get in some shade, and drink something cool. With over a hundred members in RDRC it is hard to define "goofy," so I'll leave that up to each of you to individually determine your level of hot weather "goofiness."


