As many of you know, our annual operation cost have risen over past years, and we foresee other items in the near future that will be tapping into our club funds. Namely, runway and cameras. Both of which have been determined to be both necessary and desired to have at our field. Though we did implement a dues increase at the beginning of last year, it was only a \$10 increase. Honestly it had little impact on our yearly financial state. Many members of our club have indicated to me it wasn't enough, and we should strongly consider revisiting that topic. So, at the October meeting we did just that. After much discussion that membership present decided on an amount of **\$125 annually**. The membership present also revisited the amounts for other club dues. It was decided to increase other membership dues like Family and associate. Some rates were determined to be set at acceptable amounts now, and will not be items voted on. Again, these were the amounts decided by the many members present. It still must be passed by a majority vote at this months meeting. I must agree with the many members present this move is much needed in RDRC to continue the services and growth of out club.

Also to be voted on is the camera funding. Or rather, the DSL account needed to provide the camera service. Many of you have enjoyed the cameras provided at RDRC for nearly two vears now. Also in that line of services is the weather station. What many don't realize is that service has been provided not by the club, but individual members. And not cheaply at that! The DSL line alone equates to \$600 a year! As many of you know, the whole camera/no camera topic has been a big issue in recent weeks. At last months meeting I moved to revisit the camera issue due to the high level of interest. As many remember, it was voted by club members present that the club would not fund the cost of cameras or the DSL line needed to have them. This WAS NOT a decision made by club officers! It was brought up by members, and voted on by members. Well, it became very apparent that the cameras were something MANY people in the club wanted to keep, and perhaps SHOULD have been at the meeting to vote on! So, with that in mind I moved we revisit that matter. And with that, we did! So here is what you'll be voting on if you make it out to the November meeting. Starting January 1st 2011, if RDRC votes to keep the cameras, the club will be paying for the DSL line needed to provide that service. Cost is \$600 a year, and the account will be put into the clubs name .Newer higher quality cameras will be installed, and better back-ups will be installed as well. This will not mean that everyone will have access to the Internet. My understanding is that the service simply doesn't have enough space to provide that. You can get more details at the meeting. Take note! The club will provide the cost of the DSL line. Cameras and equipment will still be provided by club members. I point this out for a good reason. In months past when the cameras went down, certain members (mainly one) were constantly called, harassed, and told they needed to get out there quick and get the cams going again because they couldn't see anything on their computers! Folks, we can't have that in the future! These guys were spending THEIR time, and THEIR money to provide this service. Who are we to badger them for something they were GIVING us?

So..... We will be voting on the DSL service this monthly. That has been a major cost to one of our club members that IF we continue to have cameras and weather SHOULD be paid for BY the club. Its only fair folks! Just for the record, I vote YES to keeping the service! If you want to counter my vote, get your butt out to the meeting!!!!!! ;)

In closing, I want to say its been my honor to serve as RDRCs president these past years. As a group we have accomplished many things and brought RDRC to a high level in the model community. We have been recognized by both other clubs and the AMA itself as a leader club in the hobby. And in many cases, other clubs have followed our lead in the way they give back to their community and the hobby itself. We have a lot to be proud of in RDRC, and all of you should be very proud of your association with this club. I look forward to many more year serving RDRC in whatever capacity is needed.
