

### PRESIDENT'S Prop-Wash

These guidelines, fully backed by your RDRC officers, will be included with your yearly membership card. Please take time to read through them, understand them, and help enforce them. All RDRC club members are responsible for maintaining a safe flying environment. If at any time you see something being done that is unsafe, bring it to the offender's or a club officer's attention.

**Thanks:** A big thank you to Larry for doing a great job as the former RDRC club president. Even though he is stepping down as president, he will still be heavily involved as the CD for the spring "Big Jim Memorial Flyin" and the fall "Fly-For-Tots" events. I would also like to thank Dave Langridge for his excellent work as the newsletter editor. I am sure his replacement, Joe Horvath, will continue on the tradition of providing RDRC members with a monthly resource for club information, besides the monthly meeting of course;)

**Meeting:** January's meeting will have dual role: a meeting to discuss the new safety guidelines and also an opportunity for everyone to enjoy some indoor electric flying. The electric flyin is open to any current AMA member (\$5 landing fee – food, drinks, and prizes will be on hand). It will be held in a new location in Wendell, NC (see attached flyer at the end of the newsletter for more information) instead of our normal Pullman house location. Dave Hedrick, our new VP and social director, has put together this event and hopefully many other future activities to coincide with our monthly club meetings.

New interest is brewing at RD-RC regarding which side of the runway is better; the East side or the West side. Various members have illustrated the runway's East side as "dead and tall grass" while others mention the runway's West side as "improved with buildings, utilities, and parking lots". #### **Arming Switches on Electric Airplanes**

This past summer, I learned of a couple of instances where an electric airplane started before the pilot was ready. In one instance, the pilot turned on the transmitter but had it improperly set to another airplane program. Evidently, the programmed airplane had the throttle reversed and when the airplane battery pack was plugged in the motor engaged. Most good ESCs are supposed to prevent this by making you put the throttle to its lowest setting before arming. I'm not sure what happened here.

In the second instance, the airplane was on the bench and the transmitter had yet to be programmed. The throttle stick was in the mid-range. Once again, when the battery was plugged in, the motor engaged.

An arming switch is a good way to prevent any accidental motor start on an electric airplane. They are most feasible on larger motors, but many electric gurus say they can be fitted to an airplane of almost any size.

Another good reason for the arming switch is to be able to plug in the battery and then prepare the airplane for flight. Many times there are cowlings or hatches that have to be secured or other preflight preparations to complete. Why do that with the battery and motor armed?

A number of commercial arming switches are out there. They are not very expensive and are easy to use. Your local hobby shop can surely provide you with one.

If you want to tackle the project in your shop, just peruse the online forums and you will find lots of pictures and schematics. Here's one in the RCGroups forum: http://www.rcgroups.com/forums/showthread.php?t=1335070

And here's an even better idea. These two clubs have posted pertinent information and how-tos on their websites for their members and others to use. I think that is a great idea. It would be a simple matter to create a link on your site to these documents or write one of your own.
