Side note: A few meetings ago when I did my talk about my NAR Level 2 Rocket (9' Tall 22.5 lb) a few club members showed some interest in that hobby. As a follow up, I wanted to briefly share my experience on what happened with the rocket. I took the Bruiser EXP-3 down to Orangeburg, SC for my certification exam. The exam for level 2 has two parts, multiple choice exam and flight proficiency. The written exam basically just covers the regulations dealing with HPR (High powered rockets – Motors bigger than G) and the flight proficiency is to shoot the rocket up, have the parachute open, and recover the rocket without having any parts broken. Level 2 deals with motors labeled J,K, and L which ranges from 140 lbs to 1125 lbs of thrust. The J-800 motor I selected with a burn time of 1.8 seconds, average thrust of 156 lbs., and peak thrust of 224 lbs. definitely got the job done on this almost 23 pound beast. Needless to say, it was a success. Just like last month there are no immediate safety concerns that need attention. Keep up the good work.

Our digit-damaged RDRC member appeared at the field two Sundays ago providing a reminder about the importance of restraining our aircraft and perhaps how they are started. Your Safety Officer had the chance to start a 50cc gas engine using a "Sullivan Ultra-Torque, Mega-Powerful, Two-Handed" starter. It sure made starting easier, especially on an engine with a history of "kicking back" and whose choke throttle was inoperable. Using such a starter requires the plane be restrained by a person who understands to push the plane slightly into starter and stop pushing as soon as the engine fires. Safety AND ease...a great combination!

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














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
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Newsletter
