We propose to mill out the rough areas that we discussed and remove 1" of asphalt in these specific areas. We will then replace it with hot mixed asphalt. Then, next season when you seal coat the entire runway, it should all be uniform. We will have a tack coat to bond the old and new surfaces; however, there may be tiny cracks that the sealer will also help to prevent moisture from penetrating into the subsurface.

It has been a very productive past two years for the RDRC club since I became president and I do not want to see that momentum stopping thus why I am running again for the 2014 President role.

My past two years have been a learning experience, I feel there have been some good decisions and some bad ones which I definitely learned from. One bad decision which I have been trying to get corrected is the runway. As the President, I should have dug into the paving company's reputation, current status, gathered references, etc. in greater detail rather than simply accepting the appointed committee's recommendation to use NU-Tech. The current status is that we are waiting to get on their schedule to have the bad spots removed and repaired by NU-Tech. This is after many months of one way phone calls, emails, and Better Business Bureau filing to at least get their attention to listen and see our concerns about their workmanship. I have personally grown from this experience as a leader which will help me provide better service to the club.

Some of the accomplishments I feel we've made include finally having a transparent view into the club's business. There is no secrecy about what the club's income and expenditures are. By publishing the club's budget monthly on the website and making it available at the club meetings, all club members know exactly what their club dues are actually being used for. So many times when I first took office people asked why club dues are where they are at. By publishing a club budget people could see that it costs over \$10,403 a year to run the club and it takes over 83 full-time memberships just to cover that budget. Luckily we have met the minimum membership requirements these past 2 years and the club budget is looking very healthy.

Another accomplishment was the upgrade of the RDRC website to give it a more modern look and feel. I am 100% for having the club's website, web cams, and weather station. For the public and club members, to have one place to find club announcements, documents, weather data, and just to see who is out at the field flying, I feel is a great benefit to the club. As of today (10/09/13) there have been over 34,000 visits to our website and even more viewers of the web cams (due to direct links to the upstream web cam feed). Based on feedback from newly joined club members on why they decided to join RDRC, it's clear that these resources are being used and are well worth the investment.

There are many other items I could cover such as field improvements, working with the county about land zoning and the future of the property we rent, proper setup and filings with the IRS, etc. but most of those topics have been covered at the club meetings. By the way, meeting minutes are available to read on the club's website along with the monthly newsletter just in case you missed either.

Moving forward, I want to continue to grow the club within the areas of activities, membership, and field improvements. If elected, I will continue the transparency of the club's business by openly talking about finances, issues, and upcoming events so there is no uncertainty about how the club is being run. The club has a business side to it whether we want to admit it or not and I welcome the challenge of maintaining it. 
