Downtown festival revs up

Scotworks is revving up for its annual "Spring Extravaganza" with a good cause in mind. This year's downtown Zebulon festival will benefit the American Cancer Society's Relay For Life.

Organizers say they're working to make the April 2 event bigger and better with a pig-picking, prizes and motorcycle contests. The menu includes barbecue pork, hot dogs, hamburgers, baked beans, slaw, salads, bread, tea, sodas and water. The only cost is a donation to East Wake Relay For Life.

Vance Street will be closed off from 9 a.m.-4 p.m., to make way for live music, a climbing wall, face painting, Muddy the Mudcat, clowns, a balloon artist, and a custom and vintage car show by the Zebulon Area Classic Car Club.

Raleigh-Durham Remote Control Club will display their remote-control aircraft. The Triangle East Amateur Radio Association will demonstrate ham radio operation.

For motorcycle enthusiasts, there's: * Cyclemax of Wilson displaying new 2005 Cruisers; * Carolina Biker magazine "Calendar Girls" on site, signing calendars and posing for photos; * J&J Leathers riding apparel; * John Earp custom bike painting and bodywork; * High Rollers custom motorcycle saddles; * Turner Trikes displaying custom-built trikes; * "Wild Bill" airbrushing and pinstriping on bikes, helmet, etc.; and * Braids by "Leather Kim" custom braiding.

The festival will also feature "one of the top bike shows in the area," said a Scotworks release. This judged event will award trophies for first, second and third place in: middle-weight cruisers (less than 1,000 cc), heavy-weight cruisers (greater than 1,000 cc), sport, touring, vintage, trike and custom classes. There will also be an award for "Best of Show."
